10 notable developments in space science in 2019

We have been reading about different top 10 news of the year. Today, lets read about the top 10 notable events/developments in space science in 2019.

- Image of brightest-ever explosion of a neutron star NASA's Neutron Star Interior Composition Explorer (NICER) telescope on the International Space Station (ISS) captured the brightest-ever explosion of a neutron star named J1808, in the Sagittarius constellation
- First-ever all-female spacewalk NASA astronauts Christina Koch and Jessica Meir, became part of the first all-female team to do a spacewalk (in a half-century of spacewalking).
- Project NETRA The Indian Space Research Organisation(ISRO) initiated a project named Project NETRA or Network for Space Object Tracking and Analysis. NETRA is an early warning system in space to detect debris* and other hazards to Indian satellites.
- First-ever student-built rocket- On 22 May 2019, a group of undergraduate students from the University of Southern California (USC) launched Traveler IV, the first-ever rocket designed and built by students.
- Nepal and Sri Lanka launch their first satellites -Both Nepal and Sri Lanka, launched their first-ever satellites from NASA's Wallops Flight Facility in the US.
- Annular Solar Eclipse India is able to view the Annular Solar Eclipse on 26 December 2019
- Chandrayaan 2 India launched its second mission to the Moon.
- First-ever image of a black-hole It was photographed by a network of eight telescopes set up by the Event Horizon Telescope team across the world. This image shows the black hole in a galaxy called Messier 87 (M87) which is 55 million light-years away.
- 50th flight of PSLV The historic 50th PSLV (Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle) flight was launched, carrying Radar Imaging Satellite RISAT-2BR1in November.
- Voyager 2 entry into interstellar space NASA's Voyager 2 has finally crossed the Sun's boundary (more than 11 billion miles from the Sun) and entered into the interstellar space, 42 years after it was launched.

- Payal Jangid is a teenage Indian girl who received the Changemaker award from Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.
- Saurabh Chaudhary is an Indian sport shooter, who won a gold medal in men's 10m Air Pistol event at the ongoing ISSF (The International Shooting Sport Federation) World Record in 2019.
- Nitesh Kumar Jangir an Indian engineer who won the 2019 Commonwealth Secretary-General's Innovation for Sustainable Development Award in London for creating breathing device for newborns
- Bandana Nepal is an 18-year-old girl from Nepal who danced for 126 Hours. With this, she has set a new Guinness World Record for "Longest Dancing Marathon by an Individual.
- Shafali Verma has become the youngest Indian cricketer to score 50 runs in an international match.
- Caroline Crouchley is a 13-year old scientist from New York who has
 designed a travel solution, which is could be better than renowned
 company Hyperloop.
- Sejal Gulia is a teenager from Bengaluru, Karnataka, who won gold at the Thailand Open worldwide fencing meet held in Bangkok. She has won two golds at the 4th Youngsters Cup and 10th Mini Nationwide Fencing Championship in ladies Epee (U-12) class.

2019 has been an exciting year in sports and many records were broken and new records have been made. Here are the top 10 sports news of the year.

- The **United States** won the FIFA Women's World Cup for the record 4th time.
- England won the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019, in the most interesting final, which was decided after a Tie-breaker.
- Kenya's **Brigid Kosgei** broke the women's marathon world record while **Eliud Kipchoge** also became the first in the world to run a marathon in under 2 hours. Jamaica's **Shelly-Ann Fraser-Pryce** also broke the record for the fastest 100-metre sprint by a woman.
- In November, South Africa won the 2019 Rugby World Cup. Japan also became the first-ever Asian country to host the Rugby World Cup.
- Mithali Raj became the first female cricketer to complete 20 years in ODI. India's Shafali Verma also became the youngest Indian to score an international half-century in cricket.
- PV. Sindhu became the first Indian to win gold at Badminton World Championships, while, Aishwarya Pissay becomes first Indian to win a world title in motorsports.
- American Simone Biles broke the World Gymnastics Championships medals record in October, surpassing Vitaly Scherbo's record of 23 medals
- Lewis Hamilton won the F1 British Grand Prix for the record sixth time.
- Fallon Sherrock became the first woman to win a match against a male opponent at the Professional Darts Corporation (PDC) world darts championship.
- Rafael Nadal won the Men's Singles title at the 2019 French Open for a record 12th time.




As the year is ending today, let us end on a happy note. Here's our roundup of the 10 top stories of progress from 2019:



- Lok Sabha elections 2019 The Lok Sabha elections were held over six phases from 11 April to 19 May. Results were declared in 24 May. The BJP came back to power with a resounding majority.
- Legislative assembly elections were also held for Sikkim, Arunachal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, and Odisha in May, at the same time as the Lok Sabha elections.
- Legislative assembly elections were held and results declared for Maharashtra and Haryana in October and Jharkhand, in December.
- Jammu & Kashmir held its first-ever Block Development Council elections in October.
- Parliamentary elections were held in the United Kingdom which saw Prime Minister Boris Johnson's Conservative Party win by a decisive majority.
- In November, Sri Lanka elected a new president Gotapaya Raiapaksa.
- Hong Kong saw an important election for the district councils in November that indicated people's support for the pro-democracy protestors.
- Elections were also held for the European Parliament in May.
- Zuzana Caputova became the first female President of Slovakia in June while Volodymyr Zelensky won Ukraine's Presidential election.
- In April, the world's biggest single-day election was held in Indonesia.

As we can see, it has been a very busy and important year in terms of elections and the results from them will decide many important issues (in both India and the world) moving forward.

Let's have a look at 10 inspiring women who have proven to be the role-models to others in 2019.

- Politician Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman is ranked at 34th place on Forbes' World's 100 Most Powerful Women list for 2019. She is India's first full-time female Union Finance Minister and previously held the post of Union Defence Minister.
- Actress Deepika Padukone The first woman to be ranked in the top five of the Forbes India Celebrity 100 list.
- Entrepreneur Kiran Mazumdar-Shaw, ranked 65 on the Forbes list, is India's richest self-made woman. She is the chairperson and managing director of Biocon Limited, a biotechnology company based in Bangalore, India
- Athlete Dutee Chand is an Indian professional sprinter and current national champion in the women's 100 metres event.
- Badminton Player PV Sindhu became the first Indian to win gold in BWF World Badminton Championships.
- **Pilot** Sub-lieutenant Shivangi was appointed as the first-ever woman pilot for the Indian Navy.
- Economist Gita Gopinath is the first female Chief Economist of International Monetary Fund (IMF).
- Financier Anshula Kant is the chief financial officer and managing director of the World Bank Group.
- Pilot Anupriya Lakra, a 27-year-old tribal woman has become the first female commercial pilot from Malkangiri district in Odisha.
- Athlete Hima Das, an Indian Sprinter won five successive gold medals in different meets across Poland and the Czech Republic within 20 days in 2019. She is the second-fastest Asian, featuring in the top-10 under-20 runners in the world in 2019.

- Nobel Prize Winners Didier Queloz, M Stanley Whittingham and Esther Duflo spoke out about the urgent need to address climate change.
- A group of **15** young Canadians sued their government for supporting fossil fuels that are responsible for climate change.
- Global climate is the average climate seen over the entire planet. The Earth has become warmer and the climate has changed across countries.

- During all these **climate protests**, the most commonly used word, 'climate strike', was named **Collins Word of the Year 2019**. The word was used 100 times more often in 2019, than as compared to 2018.
- As part of the second wave of global 'climate strikes', Greta Thunberg joined 500,000 people at climate demonstrations in Montreal, Canada.
- Swedish climate activist Greta Thunberg was one of the recipients of the 2019 Right Livelihood Award. The prize is also known as Sweden's alternative Nobel Prize.
- Climate activist Greta Thunberg also delivered a powerful and emotionally-charged speech at the UN Climate Action Summit. Ms Thunberg told the participating member nations that the future generation will never forgive them if they fail to act on climate change effectively now.
- Climate crisis: UN Climate Action Summit 2019 60 heads of states participated in the UN Climate Action Summit 2019, in New York, US. The aim of the summit was to urge governments to come with concrete and meaningful plans for action. Each leader presented their ideas and plans to fight strongly against the climate crisis.
- The United Kingdom became the first country in the world to pass a national emergency on climate change.

- A number of celebrities also showed their support for the campaign.
- Actress Dame Helen Mirren read bed time stories to those sleeping out in Trafalgar Square.
- In New York, actor Will Smith gave a speech to hundreds of people in Times Square.

Who are the homeless people?

- People who can't afford housing, are unemployed and poor end up living on the streets.
- Also those who suffer from mental illness and lack the services needed for treatment.
- People who are into substance abuse (drug addicts) and lack the support they need to kick the habit.

The Sleep Out campaign is meant to shine a spotlight on the global issue of homelessness that so many people face, including refugees. It aims to raise \$50 million for the cause.

10 biggest protests around the world in 2019

Russia, Serbia, Ukraine and Albania, France, Bolivia, Lebanon, Chile, Spain, Iraq, Guinea, Hong Kong, the UK, Sudan, Ecuador, Cameroon, Egypt and currently India have all seen major demonstrations.

Here, we present the top 10 protests occurred across the world in 2019.

- Hong Kong One of the biggest protests of 2019, opposing a proposed bill that would have allowed Hong Kong citizens to be extradited to mainland China. Approximately 2 million people participated in the protest.
- Bolivia Bolivians in October protested claiming election fraud against President Evo Morales. At least 31 people have been killed during the protest.
- Chile Chileans in Santiago, the capital of Chile, protested over proposed hikes in subway fares. Protests soon spread to other parts of the country demanding income equality, better health care and education.
- Iran Protests broke out across Iran after the government announced a 50% increase in gasoline prices. More than 140 protesters died in 22 cities across the nation.
- Iraq Anti-corruption protests across the country costing 350 lives.
- Lebanon People protested against corruption and for a new government.
- Russia Agitation against the government in which opposition candidates were barred for city council elections.
- **Spain** Protest against long prison sentences for nine separatist leaders for holding an illegal referendum in 2017.
- Sudan Protests against its former dictator Omar al-Bashir led to his overthrow and the formation of a new democratic government in Sudan.
- India Against the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA), which provides citizenship for non-Muslim illegal immigrants from 3 neighbouring countries who are subjected to religious persecution.

10 influential Indian personalities that we lost in 2019

We lost many famous and beloved people this year. Today, let us remember some of the important and influential Indian personalities that passed away in 2019.

- **George Fernandes** George Fernandes passed away in January 2019. He was a former Union and Defence minister. He held various portfolios or government responsibilities during his lifetime.
- Manohar Parrikar Manohar Parrikar was the first IIT alumnus to become the Chief Minister of Goa in 2000. He was also the Defence Minister of India from 2014-2017. He passed away in March.
- Sushma Swaraj Former External Affairs Minister, Sushma Swaraj was a respected and experienced politician. Known as the People's Minister, Sushma Swaraj was a member of Parliament for seven times.
- Arun Jaitley Arun Jaitley was India's former Finance and Defence Minister. He introduced the GST (Goods and service tax) when he was Finance Minister in 2017.
- Ram Jethmalani A well-known lawyer, Ram Jethmalani passed away in September 2019. He also served as the Union law minister under Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

- Sheila Dixit Sheila Dixit was the Chief Minister of Delhi for 15 years, from 1998-2013. She is the longest-serving female Chief Minister of any Indian state. She passed away in July 2019.
- Justice Venkatachala Justice Venkatachala was a reputed former judge of the Supreme Court.
- Girish Karnad A director, actor and play writer, Girish Karnad's plays have been translated and performed in English and many other regional languages. He was awarded the Padma Shri for his contribution in theatre and the Padma Bhushan for literature.
- Ramakant Achrekar Achrekar Sir was Sachin Tendulkar's coach. He
 was also one of the most loved and respected cricket coaches of India.
 He was recognized for his contribution to the sport, with awards
 including the Dronacharya Award and the Padma Shri.
