





Canada pushes for "Online News Act!"

Canada is trying to create a law called the "Online News Act". As a result, this law would make companies like Google and Facebook pay local news publishers for their content on social media.

The goal is to help the local news industry be more diverse and independent. Further, the government thinks this law will also help the economy.

On the contrary, Google and Facebook don't like this law. Firstly, they say it is not fair to make them pay for news they did not make. Secondly, Facebook even said they would block news for Canadians if the law passes.

The law has not been passed yet, but other countries like Australia and New Zealand have passed similar laws. In addition, the government in Australia says it has helped news companies pay more people. To sum up, people who support this law say it will help local news publishers keep working and make more money from advertisements on Google and Facebook.

China-rivalling nuclear submarine collaboration!

The Presidents of Australia, the US, and the UK will announce a nuclear submarine collaboration. The leaders of these countries will meet to explore ways in which they may collaborate with one another to ensure the safety of their respective nations. In a similar vein, a fresh strategy should be developed to supply Australia with robust submarines.

First, the goal of the nuclear submarine partnership is to compete with China's plans to be the strongest naval power in the Pacific. Secondly, the advanced submarines are expected to arrive as early as 2032. Importantly, analysts believe that if this plan if the plan works, it will be the biggest and most important partnership to work together to stay safe.

Meanwhile, China is worried that the three countries will compete to make more powerful weapons. In addition, Chinese officials stated that these countries are not helping to stop the spread of dangerous weapons. Further, they should stop acting like they are in a big competition and start doing things to make the area peaceful & safe.

Belgian restricts TikTok over privacy concerns!

TikTok is not allowed to be used on government-issued phones in Belgium. TikTok is a video-sharing platform that is owned by the Chinese company ByteDance. The National Security Council of Belgium issued a warning about the potential dangers associated with TikTok. The authorities stated that TikTok collects enormous amounts of data that could put the users' privacy at risk

Firstly, Belgian government employees will no longer be permitted to use the video app TikTok. Secondly, TikTok is also required to cooperate with Chinese intelligence services. As a result, the Belgian authorities found it reasonable to restrict access to the TikTok app on federal government phones. Importantly, the authorities feel that they need to give utmost importance to the confidentiality of users' data.

Meanwhile, TikTok said that the Chinese government can't force other countries to give up information that is stored in their own countries. In a similar way, the European Commission and the European Parliament banned their employees from using TikTok on their phones a month ago.

President Xi Jinping begins 3rd term!

Xi Jinping enters his third and last term as president of China. The National People's Congress (NPC) voted to endorse Mr Xi who is 69 years old. The National People's Congress (NPC) is a law-making body and, according to the People's Republic of China's constitution, the highest state authority.

The National People's Congress has nearly 2,900 members. They voted in favour of Xi's reappointment. Importantly, none of them refrained from the vote or voted against Xi Jinping. Thus, on March 10, 2023, Xi Jinping was formally re-appointed to his position as President for a third and final term of five years. Analysts feel that this reform had brought back closer Communist Party oversight over government bodies.

Political analysts believe that his re-appointment highlights Xi's unchallenged control and the return of one-man rule to China. The National People's Congress (NPC) also approved a comprehensive plan to restructure the government in going ahead with some of Mr Xi's most important policy goals.

Foreign lawyers & firms can work in India!



A few Indian states demand that "lightning" be designated as a "natural disaster." Disaster management specialists say lightning kills more people than any other calamity. The State Disaster Response Fund (SDRF) provides financial aid to those impacted. The following claims were made at the National Platform for Disaster Risk Reduction Conference in Delhi.

IMD experts state that lightning strikes impact nearly 2,500 people annually. In addition, the Indian state of Bihar loses an average of 300 people annually due to lightning. Even though the highest number of people impacted was highest in Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Chhattisgarh, and Odisha. On the contrary, the frequency of lightning strikes was highest in the northeastern states. In addition to West Bengal, Sikkim, Jharkhand, Odisha, and Bihar.

India is one of just five countries in the entire globe that possesses an early warning system for lightning. This technology provides lightning forecasts five days to three hours in advance.

China sends space camera to help Egypt!

China and Egypt are working together to make new things that can go up into space. They made a new remote-sensing satellite called Horus 2. The satellite is like a big camera that can take pictures of the Earth. Further, this is the second satellite that China and Egypt are working on together, with more to come.

Horus 2 was launched by a rocket called Long March 2C from a desert in China. The rocket flew into space and released the satellite, which is now orbiting the Earth. Horus 2 is a satellite that was launched into space by Egypt in collaboration with the Chinese government. The satellite is named after the ancient Egyptian god Horus, who was often depicted as a falcon.

Horus 2 is a remote-sensing satellite, which means it is designed to capture images and data from space to learn more about Earth's surface. That's 57% more than the previous year, claims a popular anti-virus software company.

Firstly, cybercriminals make fake websites for popular games like Roblox, Minecraft, Fortnite, and Apex Legends. Then they trick kids into downloading bad things. For example, in 2022, there were over more than eight lack fake websites for these games. Secondly, the bad guys trick kids by offering cheats and tutorials. Then, they instruct the kids to turn off their antivirus software so the bad files won't be detected. Thus, this makes it easy for bad guys to steal information from kids' devices.

More importantly, cybercriminals don't care how old you are. They even attacked games for little kids aged 3 to 8. In the end, they want to get to the kids' parent's devices.

Spectacular butterfly-shaped solar flares!



Astronomers saw something cool on the sun. They saw a coronal mass ejection that looked like a butterfly with plasma wings. Also, the explosion was so big that it went towards Mercury. This kind of explosion is called a coronal mass ejection (CME). It happens when the sun's magnetic fields knot and then snap. It releases a lot of energy and can make big plumes of solar material that go out into space.

Firstly, when the sun has an explosion called a coronal mass ejection, it shoots out really fast and can collect charged particles to make a big wave. Most look like smoke rings or halos. Secondly, the researchers couldn't see what caused the butterfly-shaped one because it was on the other side of the sun. Also, this time it didn't hit Earth, but it hit Mercury.

Thirdly, when a CME hits Earth, it could cause geomagnetic storms that make the northern lights. Also, the strong ones can mess up satellites and even the internet. Scientists think there will be more storms in the next few years, and they will be the strongest in 2025.

Indo-Pacific's Quad Cyber Challenge!

Scientists use Math to study the brain!



Researchers have found that mathematical models can help us understand how electricity moves through the brain. The brain has a complex network of nerve fibres that send electrical signals all over the brain.

Scientists can use invasive electrodes to track these signals in patients with special conditions, like severe epilepsy. Further, they also used MRI scans to create a map of the brain's nerve fibres. Firstly, there are two ways that signals can move through the brain network: Either by the shortest path or By diffusing through many connections.

However, scientists to date have been unsure which way is correct or preferred by the brain signals. Secondly, the research found that the diffusive flow theory is more accurate. This means that many connections shape how electricity moves through the brain.

This information could help scientists design better treatments for mental health problems.

Temple Treasures Uncovered in Odisha!

Secondly, they also found a special pot that is important to the Hindu religion. Interestingly, researchers claim that the place where they were exploring used to be ruled by important families a long time ago.

The temple was built a long time ago, maybe in the 13th-15th century when a powerful family called Eastern Ganga Dynasty ruled the area. Further, the temple is in ruins now, but the researchers found big blocks of stone and carvings that show how beautiful it once was. What's really interesting is that the temple ruins were discovered by a local man who saw them when the bushes were cleared for the railway.

Heartbeat influences time perception!



Tik tok star Ckay from Nigeria loves Bollywood!



Diphylleia grayi is the scientific name for the flower commonly known as the skeleton flower. It features dainty small blooms that are all white on the inside.

When it rains, the blooms of the Skeleton flower become translucent. In other words, they transform into a clear substance similar to water. And when the petals are dried, they revert back to their original white colour! Upon becoming moist, the gaps in their cell structure lead the colour to become less vibrant. This is clearly visible in the petals.

Rain causes the cells of flower petals to fill with water, which causes the petals to become see-through. After that, as soon as it stops raining, the water evaporates and the skeleton flowers revert back to their original colour, which is white.

The skeleton flower is indigenous to the more temperate regions of Japan, China, and the Appalachian Mountains in the United States, where it can be found growing on the wet, wooded slopes of mountain ranges.

Pineapple – Healthify!

The flesh of the pineapple, which is yellow on the interior, is a fruit that is juicy, sweet, and fragrant. It has waxy leaves and a short plant that can grow up to one or two metres in height.

When the plant blooms, it usually produces about 200 flowers. Thereafter, individual fruits of the flowers join together to become a single large, fruit! You can eat it fresh, frozen, cooked, juiced etc. Pineapples are native to South America. However, pineapples from Hawaii, the US, are very famous across the world.

Arancini is Italian for "small orange," and the dish gets its name from the fact that once it's cooked, it resembles an orange quite closely.

Arancini has been a part of traditional Southern Italian cuisine for several centuries. It is believed to have originated in the Italian city of Sicily during the 10th century. In this dish, rice balls are stuffed with various items, coated with bread crumbs and then deep-fried. The stuffings vary from region to region. The common fillings include meat sauce with peas, sliced meat, cheeses (like provolone, mozzarella or pecorino), eggplant and tomatoes.

There are two primary variations of the original arancini dish. The first one has the shape of a perfect circle and is stuffed with a ragu sauce that consists of beef, mozzarella, and peas. The second one is loaded with mozzarella, prosciutto, and grated cheese, and it is shaped more like a pear and is longer than it is wide.




